

What does He Want us to Pray For?

We are learning what pleases Him, even if it's not in the bible, even if there is no command against it (Eph 5:10). We must learn what pleases Him in every situation. The Holy Spirit prays with longing too deep for words. The Holy Spirit prays in us and through us. So when we pray, it is through the Holy Spirit urging in us, forming His thoughts into words. Rom 8:26 is a reality going on in us right now, for those who are led by the Spirit. Verses 14-15 — You can know who are and aren't His children by who cries out *Abba, Father*. This is what proves who has eternal life and who knows the mind of the Spirit. Have you cried, "Abba! Help me! Abba, I need you!" a few times today? We need Him. We cannot live a day without going to the throne of grace crying, *Abba, Father!* That is how we know we are children. What does the Holy Spirit want? What does He want us to do? What is He groaning for within us? Does He want these courts to be finished? Does He want Segunda Eva to be finished? Does He want us to have the wealth of the nations brought in? Isa 61:4 — we, us, the edah will eat, feed off of the wealth of the nations. That is what He wants us to pray for because that is His will and His word. Acts 4:32 — No one had need because the wealth came in. That is the will of our Father. The Holy Spirit within us lays it in our heart to pray for the twelve tribes to be raised up and for our brothers and sisters to be strengthened, in order that we would all be blameless and holy at His coming. We have to find out what the Holy Spirit is praying about and pray according to His will and nothing else. It does no good to pray for anything except according to His will. And if we *know* that He hears us (if we have a good conscience), then He will give us what we ask for (1 Jn 5:15).

1 Pet 3:8 says that our collective prayers can be hindered if just one husband is not treating his wife as the weaker vessel. If there is one person not treating his wife right, or one person not treating another right, then our prayers are hindered. We had better watch out how we treat one another. Our prayers might be hindered because our conscience will not allow us to pray confidently, boldly (Heb 4:16). If we are praying according to His will, we are in touch with the Holy Spirit and His Spirit leads us and guides us to the word, which leads us and guides us so we would not lead a fruitless life (1 Jn 3:22; 5:15).
