

## Prayer, Millet, and His Ultimate Purpose

A word of instruction:

There is a limitation to how long we can hold up our hands. We must pray for the *essential* things, not duplicating or repeating prayer. We have to listen to what our brothers are saying and give an *Amen* so we won't repeat the same thing that someone else said.

Ha-emeq — When I translate for Nahaliel when he prays, ~~is~~ just like me praying it because everything he says, I say exactly the same and I have to be saying it in my heart. If we all prayed like that every time we pray then we would all be *together* and you would never repeat what was already prayed because you already said it in your heart.

Elezar — You make that prayer the desire of your own heart.

Yoneq — ~~This~~ what AMEN means.

*[We found a place to get millet!!!!]*

*Millet is one of the most wonderful foods you can eat. Millet has laetrile in it — it combats cancer. Birds love it. Some people say it's for the birds. Birds aren't dying of cancer — but men are. The whole world is under the power of the evil one — a deluding influence. So we can eat millet every day — like manna. If we have eggs from our own chickens we can eat it with eggs sometimes, but with the awful things they do to chickens to produce eggs, we don't want to eat so many of them.*

We are heading towards a more normal, natural life. We are not there, but we are headed in that direction. If we are going to live in the city, we have to have farms. A man told us that there is a big market for organic food here but no one can get it. So it is something we can pray for (if we desire it with all of our heart) according to His will. We have to be in fellowship with Him and pray according to His will, then we know He hears us.

What we pray for in our sacrifices is for our *existence* here on earth.

The Jews killed their own savior. Our Master asked His Father to forgive them, "because they don't know what they're doing." Do you think they would have killed Him if they knew who He was? They did not recognize Him when He came because of their callused heart. But those who did receive Him, He gave them the power to be called Sons of God. So we honor and extol the very savior the Jews rejected and killed. But He rose from the dead on the third day just like the scriptures said, and He's coming back to Israel. And one third of the Jews will receive Him then. But two thirds still won't.

David Derush — ~~in~~ thankful that we know who we are and our purpose that we existed in the thoughts of our Father before the whole universe and the universe was created for us — so we could fill it — and also to know about Abraham and where we came from and that, in the future, we're going to be sons of God, exactly like YAHSHUA in our function. We are part of His plan and purpose He has for the end and we are living now step by step to bring about the end. We just need to keep doing what we are doing.

In Eph 1:4 He chose us, but in v. 11, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit were in council and they obviously discussed us.

He is going to fill up the *universe* — all things (Eph 4:10) with Himself. (Eph 3:21) Forever and ever people will be born, from generation to generation, forever and ever without end, and the universe will fill up with man. Remember Gen 1:26-28? It is waiting; it has been put off until *all things* have been renewed and restored and redeemed from the work of Satan. Gen 1:26-28 was *before* Satan tempted Eve and all mankind was subject to death. Gen 1:26-28 has been put off — He didn't forget about His plan for man and the earth and the universe. Man was created to rule over all things, to fill the earth and then colonize all the planets. But now that man has fallen, it has to be redeemed man who will do this. Ps 8 says man is going to rule over all creation. Ps 8 doesn't even take the fall into account.

David (the Psalmist) was thinking about the redemption of man when he would rule over *all* the universe, stars, planets. Redeemed man, the sons of Abraham, were chosen to rule over the nations. Gen 1:26-28 is the purpose the nations were created for which has been put off for 7000 years until heaven and earth pass away and a new heaven and new earth comes. Our Master did not come (Mt

5:17-18) to do away with the law but to fulfill everything and bring it back to Gen 1:27-28. He first has to redeem man to fulfill that so that man can rule over all the works of His hands — so the nations can rule over His creation and we, the sons of Abraham, can rule over the nations.

The people of the nations who stay within the boundaries of the second covenant (Gen 3:16-19), who have not committed abominable intolerable acts against their conscience, these people are going to be worthy of the eternal nations. The nations will walk by the light of our twelve tribes and they will always be giving us glory, bringing glory into the city, of those people who are ruling over them in love and righteousness. (Rev 21:2,3,9, 12).

Who is that twelve tribes? His people, the wife of the lamb, the twelve tribes of Israel. It is the multifaceted Body of Messiah in which every member is different and each and every one radiates an aspect of the resplendent glory of our Master YAHSHUA. We will shine out as beacon lights in the universe; we are going to be shining out his firmament, shining out the glory of our Master like stars forever and ever (Dan 12:3). It sounds lofty, doesn't it? But it only sounds that way because it's so vast (1 Cor 2:9).

Gen 1:28 — man is not fulfilling what God created him for. He is not capable of doing this because he is fallen. So God is redeeming man and then someday man in the restored nations will live on the earth the way God intended in the beginning in Gen 1:28. Right now he can only attempt to do that because they are always going to fail because man has a fallen nature. But one day (Rev 20:10) the enemy, through us, is going to be bound and then in the eighth day, even cast into the lake of fire forever and ever with all the other worthless things and people with evil hearts wanting only to do their own thing their own way — live by their own desires; they are obstinate, worthless to God. God will cast them into the lake of fire. They say in their heart there is no God. Then after the enemy is done away with, mankind will revert back to Gen 1:28 and will go on forever and ever without stopping. God's plan has been on hold for a while. His plan went on hold there, at the fall of man, and then there was to be a period of time until it was resumed. The first 1000 years He had Noah, the second — Abraham, the third — Moses, the fourth — Messiah. Then, at the beginning of the fifth thousand years He had the first church and it fell. Then there is this time of restoration that we are in now, and then, after all of these 6000 years, will be a thousand years and then the eighth day.

There was a time of redemption between the fall of the first church and the thousand years. In the first century our Master came and was crucified, the temple was destroyed in 70 AD, and the first church fell. And then all this time has passed and now we are raising up a light to the nations and the time will *soon* come, after the end of the 6000 years, when God will fully have tested every person and those who fell under Satan's temptation (Rev 21:8) will be cast into the lake of fire — that is after the end of the seven thousand years, a resurrection to judgment but all those who had lived with a good conscience will, after dying for their sins committed within the second covenant will be resurrected and live forever and ever in the nations (Rev 21:24) — and God's purpose will finally be fulfilled.

There were a *few* covenants before Gen 12. The first one is the covenant with Adam and Eve to rule the world and subdue all things and when the earth was filled up with people who serve the Creator and fulfill His purpose on earth, God had billions of other planets waiting to be inhabited. But that plan was put on hold because man fell. So we are in the process of being restored right now. I hope you can see a little of how this is put together. We are the generation that is living at the end of the age. The time of restoration is now. All of this past history in the scriptures was written for these people living at the end of the age. All the stories, *everything* is for us, so we won't fall in the same way they fell (1 Cor 10:11).

Mt 21:34 — There will be a generation of people who will not see death until all things are fulfilled when Messiah returns to this earth (1 Ths 4:16-17) — we will not die. We are the most privileged people on the face of the earth. There is nothing to be compared with our chosen-ness, with how our Father selected us for this very purpose. And for this, we should be filled with exuberant joy. But of course there is an evil one who comes to rob that joy. He is always trying to destroy what our Master is doing. But our

Master came to destroy those works of the evil one (1 Jn 3:8). Those who are circumcised, they have self-judgment. They have a circumcised heart. They have to be examples to the others because the others must come into more self-judgment. We are all coming to have a circumcised heart so we can all have self-judgment, so that all He promised to Abraham can come true.

Gen 17:8 — He chose Abraham and He made a covenant, concerning the rule of God, with Abraham and with those who would be the seed of Abraham in the spiritual sense — they would be the sons of God and rule as the sons of God in the universe. And that is who we are. The edah rules with Messiah over those unending generations (Eph 3:21) that the nations will produce forever and ever.
