

Acclamation

What does the word *acclamation* mean? *Acclamation* is a loud shout. Why would you shout loud? Just for shouting? What do you shout? What do you acclaim? When do you acclaim?

Ps 89:14-18 — What does verse 15 say? Actually it says, “Blessed are those who have learned to acclaim You.” I never really knew what the word *acclaim* meant. I had to look it up this morning. Sometimes in English we don't really know what a word means, because we don't use it too much. What does it say in verse 15? *How blessed are the people who have learned to acclaim You.*

What do they do all day long? What do we do all day long? Verse 16 — What does it mean to *bân Your name*? It means to be *in Him*. There is no difference between being “in His name” and being “in Him”. Like Tamar (*Gidon's wife*) is in Gidon. She took on his name. We are in Messiah. We were baptized into Him. We came into Israel.

What does *exult* mean, like in Zeph 3:11? He will do away with the exulting ones because they exult in the wrong spirit. In Ps 89 they exult in the right spirit.

Verse 17 — *Horn* means a strong one. Yahshua is our horn, our strong one.

It is not easy to read the Bible. It is work to really understand. We have to pray to really understand.

Otherwise we read with shallowness. Reading here in Ps 89 exposes us, making it clear that we have to still go a long way.

The joyful sound is acclaiming our Master. When we hear the trumpet is it a joyful sound? Or is it, “Oh no, I have to go to the sacrifice”? Only those who walk in the light know the joyful sound. Some people exult in His presence.

Zeph 3:9-11 — This is kind of a picture of us. Verse 11 — Those who shout for joy, who acclaim Yahshua. It doesn't mean that they are actually worshipping. Blessed are those who are learning to acclaim Him. Have you ever heard someone really shout for joy? You know it is true joy. There are a lot of people who offer up praises that are not genuine. The people that walk in the light can almost detect it but they are afraid to, lacking confidence.

Verse 11 — Deceit, false worship, false sacrifices. In our Breaking of Bread is it really a thanksgiving offering? Is it really a joyful sound to our Master? Is it really acclaiming Him?

Verse 13 — There will be a great shaking. There are many little shakings, but after this big shaking; verse 13 will happen.

We are learning to acclaim Him. All the things that hinder us are being worked out of us.

ha Adon YAHSHUA ha Mashiyach means, “the Sovereign YAHSHUA the Messiah.”
