## **Satisfying the Law**

Yahshua told the leper not to tell anyone that He healed him, and the leper told everybody. He told us to tell everyone and we don't tell anybody.

Rom 13:8 — Whoever practices loving one another has perfectly satisfied the lawFulfilled means perfectly satisfied. If we love one another, the law has nothing to accuse us for. It is at rest. There is nothing we're not doing that we should be doing according to the law. The law is fulfilled.

Verse 9 — The law is satisfied if we love our neighbor. "Summed up" means put at rest, leaving no accusation. Love satisfies the law.

Ignoring a person, not encouraging a person when he needs it, is also doing wrong. The law condemns such action.

Rom 8:1 speaks of those who don't walk according to the flesh, but the Spirit. Verse 4 — If we walk according to the Spirit, we fulfill the righteous requirements of the law. What's doing wrong to a neighbor? Not loving him when he needs it.

1 Jn 3:10 — devil, adversary, accuser — This is the way to distinguish God's true children, those who truly, really know Him. There is a way to distinguish so we won't make any mistake. The day will come when He'll say, "I don't know you."

If we don't love our brother we aren't God's children — we are Satan's children. Love fulfills the law. The law has no condemnation for those who love their brother. Our Master didn't come to do away with the law, but to satisfy the law (Mt 5:17). He came so that the law wouldn't condemn us, and that we wouldn't have guilt from not being able to keep the law, but that we would be able to satisfy it.

Heb 2:2 — The message spoken through angels is the law. Verse 3 — How do we pay attention to this great salvation we have? How do you neglect the salvation of God? We can't neglect it. How do we neglect it? We have to understand this. We have to have revelation about this. We need to know what it's talking about. It has to find a home in our heart. Even the word here has to come to rest. There can be no accusation against us. We need to take advantage of this great salvation we have, hearing the word every day. We need to be *doers* of the word.

Many don't realize this great salvation. Many have drifted away from it. Is that an unconscious process? (Heb 2:1). They are drifting to one side where the rocks are. They drifted out of the stream.

Have you ever drifted? What does it mean? Drifting is an unconscious process.

They didn't have a Bible back then. They couldn't go to the bookstore. They had to pay attention to what they heard or they'd drift away from it. There is a tendency in us all to drift. A *tendency* is a driving force. There is a tendency to not do what we've heard. It's good — our Abba gets only those who love Him enough to pay attention to His word. This is His predetermined plan.

If your child doesn't pay attention to you, what does it mean?

We have to fulfill and satisfy all that the prophets have spoken. Yahshua came to do that. Did He fulfill it experientially? No — He is the light in the Twelve Tribes. He died to procure His offspring.

Those who have revelation have responsibility to spread, shed the light.

Let's get up and pray that we wouldn't drift away, but that we would be able to satisfy the law. When we're drifting it accuses us.

We want to keep the law satisfied by loving. There is no condemnation for those who are in Messiah, in fellowship, loving. If we do this, the law is satisfied.

## **About Weddings**
