The Three Eternal Destinies #100Reaping

A person cannot get out of what he has reaped. If a person has been reaped this is where he is. Once you are reaped you are reaped. Once you have reaped you are reaped. A person reaps what he has sown (Rev 14:14-20; Hos 8:7-8; Rom 6:21-23; 2 Cor 9:6).

Gal 6:7-8 — A man reaps what he sows. The one who sows to please himself from that natural instinct will reap destruction, ruin, turmoil, regret, and anguish. The one who sows to please the one who has saved him from the eternal destiny of the second death, will, from the Spirit, from the Savior of his life, reap eternal reward (2 Cor 3:17-18). Do not be deceived, God cannot be mocked — a man reaps what he sows.

Obviously the first Edah, as old Israel, reaped destruction, according to the word. The first Edah reaped Christianity today, as old Israel in Hos 8:7-8 was swallowed up among the nations. Christianity is a worthless thing. Israel was YHWH's chosen people (Ex 19:5; Amos 3:2), as was the first Edah (1 Pet 2:9-10). But since they both conformed to the world, they both lost their special identity as a holy nation, a distinct people belonging to Him, and so became worthless (Lk 14:34-35).

Mt 21:33-45 — Israel and the Edah reaped what they sowed. If Christianity today (or any part of it, any association with, or identity in her) *is* the fruit of the kingdom — the result or produce or fruit of Messiah's suffering — then we must renounce Him as the *true* Messiah. Jn 13:34-35 and 17:20-23 is proof that Christianity is not what He died for, or prayed for, or paid for, or what He saved (Mt 7:20).

Hos 8:8 — a vessel that one has no pleasure in (2656), not a valuable thing:

not acceptable, not delighted in, not desired, not purposeful, not a willing vessel.

The vessel became valueless, worthless, an ignoble vessel. Ex 19:5; Amos 3:2-3 — Israel, just as the first Edah, became complacent about her privileged status as the chosen people. Peter wrote 1 Pet 2:9-10; Paul said Acts 26:6-7. Acts 2:42,44,45 and 4:32-35 was the beginning, strength, prosperity of the new Israel, producing the fruit of the kingdom (Mt 21:43). But overconfidence (Rom 11:20-22) gave rise to complacency and indifference about their privileged status as YHWH's newly-chosen holy nation and people (Amos 3:1-3).

We are a family (*mishpachah*, #4940). We are separated to YHWH and for His purpose (Isa 53:10-11). When we stop being a family, we become a worthless vessel for YHWH. Christianity is no family, as Gen 12:3 or Amos 3:1-3 says. Jer 31:1 — No person can believe in Messiah without a witness of the gospel, and an apostle who establishes this witness. The Bible is not a witness, neither is a tract or even a Freepaper.
