The Three Eternal Destinies #112Fate versus Destiny

Destiny is the Eternal State that is determined by Human will . It is the place at the end of the journey of a person's life in this age, his Eternal Destiny determined by his deeds.

A person's destiny is unalterable after one dies (Heb 9:27). The first death is *Fate*. It is unavoidable. But the second death can be avoided, now.

Gen 2:9,17 is unavoidable *Fate*. But Rev 21:8 is not. Gen 2:17 is the first death. Rev 21:8 is the second death. No one has to do what is mentioned in Rev 21:8 or 22:15 or Rom 1:24,26,28-31. The second death is not one's fate. It is a man's choice, just as was Gen 2:9,17; 3:6 — after their choice, there was no way to alter the first death. Messiah is the only way to undo the first death, *Fate* (1 Jn 3:8; Heb 2:14). If one is unjust or filthy as Rev 22:11, Messiah is the only means by which his Destiny can be avoided (1 Cor 6:9-11). Even the Righteous person's Fate is sealed in Rev 22:11 in a first death and not a second death.

The only way there can be any unsealing of fate is by the Spirit (Eph 1:13). His Spirit overpowers Fate and grants a new Destiny.

A Bus called Destiny

This Bus called *Destiny* or *The Twelve Tribes* is to be sent out for a designated time to travel, according to the leading of the Spirit. It will be full of evangelists sent out to preach.

Set up tables downtown in every city with the sign, *The Three Eternal Destinies of Man*. In each city stay as long as the fruit is ripe. Make disciples to send back to the tribes. Papers will continually be printed and sent to them by another bus, maybe with other evangelists to replace those who must return. Establish Way-Out Houses.
