

More about the Good Samaritan

Rev 21:24 — You will see the nations are those who are saved from the second death and they will walk in the light of the holy ones. But the monks who tampered with the text took out “those who are saved.” The nations will continue to walk in the light of the Holy City throughout eternity. We are not a light yet, maybe a little spark. We, ourselves, are just learning because we are just coming out of all the ways, habits, and customs of the nations. But at least we are learning. We are becoming a holy nation, a light to the nations.

ha-emeq — It must have been so hard for the disciples. Because they knew they didn’t keep the law perfectly. They knew they weren’t like the Pharisees and they knew Yahshua was better than the Pharisees. And there He was saying, “You’ve heard it said you should not murder, but I say to you whoever is angry with your brother shall be in danger of judgment.” It must have made them feel so inadequate to hear the commandments He was giving them. Every new commandment He gave them must have put them lower and lower. “We can’t do this!” But He sent the helper. He said, “I have to go, because if I don’t go, He can’t come. But when He comes He can put them in your heart and He’ll help you.” And here our Father has chosen the weakest and smallest — those who would say, “Help me!” The good Samaritan did the best he could have done, for a man from the nations. But if he had been of the Holy, he would have brought him home to live with him the rest of his life.

Our Master told his disciples to go to Jerusalem, *Samaria*, and all the parts of the world. Yahshua remembered those people who were there.
