## The Conscience

The word "conscience" means to know with. This is the inner faculty that accuses you when you have done wrong and commends you when you have done right (Rev 22:12; 20:12-13; Rom 2:15; Gen 3:22

.

A good conscience is one that functions properly. Titus 1:15; Jms 4:17 – When you sin against your conscience, you defile it and it cannot function properly. If you persist in sinning you can sear your conscience so that it becomes hardened (Eph 4:19; 1 Tim 4:2). This leads to an evil conscience.

For us, Heb 10:22 is an absolute necessity, or we will sin as Heb 10:26-27 says. We are able to exercise our conscience so that it becomes strong (Mt 6:22-23; Acts 24:16; Heb 5:11-14). Conscience is what we *know* with. It is the means by which we know the difference between good and evil (Gen 3:22). Therefore no man has an excuse when he stands before Him in the judgment, which determines his eternal destiny (Rev 22:11-12).

If it were not true that Gen 3:22 was inherently the knowledge all mankind has as a gift of God, then Noah in Gen 9:1 would not have been able to understand what God Himself was telling him. Gen 9:1-7 is man's responsibility before God. Man is accountable for every secret thing, whether what is done is good or evil (Ecc 12:14; Rev 20:12; 22:12).
