Accomplishing our Created Purpose

Where would we be if we died right now? Sometimes we don't really know that.

Paul rejoiced in these things, the adversities they went through. If we're not giving thanks, I guess we're not overcoming. But, we need to be.

I was thinking today that we could just be breathing air, not doing anything good, but just breathing — a purposeless life, purposeless living.

The judgment of the nations will be according to the works they did — good deeds or bad deeds. A layabout is not hurting anyone, but he is not doing anything good either. He is just breathing air, being purposeless. Our Father put the knowledge of good and evil in each person, so, if they don't do good to someone, help someone, then they are responsible.

If a person is kind to someone, it makes the other person want to be kind. Many of us experienced this when someone did something kind to us. It made us so thankful, so that we wanted to do something to others.

If a person is not doing anything good, not helping anyone, maybe he is not doing anything bad, but he is not doing anything good either.

If a farmer is working hard by the sweat of his brow all his life, then he will help his neighbor also. It's consistent. It wouldn't be consistent to work by the sweat of his brow, and not help his neighbor. All worthless things go to the second death. We need to understand this.

I want to accomplish something. I want to accomplish His will. This is the purpose I was created for. If I'm not doing our Father's will, then I'm worthless.

Gidon is always doing things prepared for him; he is always serving. We really want to serve in the Body, and that's part of it. If we serve, we worship. If you are serving and giving your life, then you walk by and see someone washing dishes, and you help. You would be consistent in other ways also. If we work our fingers to the bone, and don't accomplish His will, then we're worthless.

In his heart, man knew he should take care of the earth. He didn't just sit there and breathe. He had motivation to do something. He was created that way.

In a city many people do nothing. They just live on the dole, eat, drink, and do nothing. They go play some ball, then eat again, play their video games — they become worthless. They are not doing anything good. Here at Stentwood Farm we need to figure out how to fix up the farm. We want people to be saved. We have a purpose. We have something to do. The Holy Spirit directs us to work together. Our children don't understand how people wake up with nothing to do. 25 to 30% of the population of England have nothing to do, except live on the dole. For people like that, the Evil one has a nest in their minds. They have no purpose.

But, now we're set free from doing nothing. I'm so thankful to have a purpose.

Our Master was Grade A, and we've been marked way down. But in Messiah we're being upgraded every day. Now we have vision for every breath that we take. This brings us up to being like the second Adam.

I used to think that people doing God's will were disappointed. What would you do if we weren't God's people? You might as well go jump in the lake.

Our Abba wants a people who are finished with having their own lives apart from our Master (Jn 12:25). The Twelve Tribes need to be brought to birth. Each tribe needs to give birth to 12,000. We need to pray diligently, with all our hearts, and then Yowceph and Benjamin can come. Nothing else but our prayers can establish that. Nothing else than that can bring it about.
