

A Liar Pays Attention to a Malicious Tongue

Concerning those who say things that are not true about us, their motive is to steer you away from salvation in Messiah. But if you are willing to do God's will, you will know the truth from error (Jn 7:17-18), and you can be delivered from the *living dead* which their gospel promotes.

Concerning Bob Pardon and his partner Judy Barba, Proverbs 17:4 in the NIV Bible says that a *wicked* person listens to evil lips; a liar pays attention to a malicious tongue. So you are just evil and a liar to boot if you listen and pay attention to what they say about us, because they are liars and do not know how to tell the truth. To lie about us is to bear false witness about us, and this is breaking the Ten Commandments (Ex 20:1-17; Jms 2:10-13). To bear false witness about us Bob Pardon had to listen and pay attention to malicious lips. He intentionally deceives and leads astray by falsehood. Lying in the Scriptures is condemned as a violation of the Law of God. To bear false witness is *intended* to harm others, and all liars, especially those who make their living by lying, have their eternal destiny in the Lake of Fire (Rev 21:8; 22:15).

Ps 10:7; Rom 3:13-18 (verse 18 describes the reason he can say the things he does, as every other person in the world who has said in his heart that there is no God (Ps 14:1-3 and Ps 53:1-3). The only people who are this way are those who say in their heart that there is no God. Bob Pardon and his partner together became worthless (Rom 3:12,8). Those who slander us are as Rom 3:9-18. *Their condemnation is just!!! Their condemnation is deserved!* What shall we conclude? Are we worse than they are? No, not at all, as it is written concerning these kind of people, "there is not one who is righteous."

Rom 3:8 — As for those who blaspheme against us, saying that we say, "Let us do evil that good may come," their condemnation is reserved by eternal justice.

Ex 20:16 — "You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor" (Dt 5:20). This means to present something that is false as truth. You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor — to lead astray from the truth (Rev 12:9; 20:3,8; Jn 8:39-47).

Pr 14:27 and Rom 3:18 — The fear of God is a fountain of life, turning a man from the *snares* that take him to eternal death (Ps 16:11; 21:4-6; Pr 12:28; 15:24). There is no fear in these men who speak against God's anointed one. There is no fear in Bob Pardon's partner Judy.
