Without Human Hands

The greatest thing that our Father is doing in the whole universe at this time is in these latter days (Dan 2:28). In the days of those ten kings (Dan 2:44; 7:24) He is cutting out the Stone (Dan 2:34-35) to fill the whole earth with that great mountain that He has made out of these stones. These building stones are foundational stones that He is individually cutting out of the mountain of this world. He is building His temple with these stones, without human hands. He has cut each of us out of the mountain of this world (Dan 2:45), and now he is dressing us to fit into His Kingdom, which will first crush Satan's kingdom and then fill the whole world. He is making out of us a great mountain, a mountain of His own making. So as we build we must build by His strength and not our own strength — with His hands, not our own. If we are building with Him we must fear to build with our own hands. Each morning and evening we go before Him to give up our own strength as a sacrifice in order to gain His supernatural strength to build with. Zec 4:6 — It's not by power or by our own strength, but by His Spirit.

So Dan 2:34-35 says that it is without human hands, which represents or signifies supernatural strength that He provides to His people to serve and to obey Him in the building of His Kingdom. Whom does He give the Kingdom to? (Dan 7:27).

The mountain in Dan 2:35 is a metaphor of a kingdom (Dan 2:44-45) — the kingdom of this world (1 Jn 5:19; Dan 2:34-35).

The latter days in Dan 2:28 is an expression meaning the very last days in human history in this age when the God of Heaven who reveals secrets, unlocks mysteries, unseals His words (Dan 12:4,9). This happens at "the end of time" (verse 10), when He intervenes in human history to establish His kingdom during the days of those ten kings at the time when He is cutting His chosen stones for its foundation out of the worldly kingdom, out from Satan's dominion and power (Eph 2:1-10). He cut them out to do the works that He has specifically prepared for each one of His chosen ones to do (1 Pet 4:10-11; Eph 2:10).

Isa 2:2-4 — As Dan 2:35 says, this kingdom will go over into the next age and fill the whole earth with its glory. Before Messiah returns, He, by His strength in His people, shall set up a kingdom (Mt 21:43), restored from the fall of the first church, which shall never again be destroyed (1 Cor 3:17) or left to another people (Dan 2:44) to restore. As the third incarnation (Jn 14:17,23) He will dwell in us (Jn 17:23).

In this kingdom He is at present laying these precious chosen stones in their place so that the foundation of this forming great nation (Isa 49:6) will never be destroyed again, but will be the means by which He will consume all these kingdoms of the world and then fill the whole Earth (Dan 2:34-35; 1 Cor 15:25). These are the days of Dan 7:24 (Rev 17:3,7,12,16) to prepare us for what is ahead (Dan 12:1,10,13), and if we die, may we also be raised upon our Master's return to our inheritance (Dan 12:13) if we have been purified, made white, refined, and come to understanding (Pr 2:5,6,21,22; Mal 3:3; Rev 3:5; 19:7-8). Unless this process in Dan 12:10 is at present going on in us, we will not be found in the Book (Dan 12:1).

That's not the book of life of the nations, but of the Kingdom. If we talk to one another, if we say, "Brother, I don't want to see you stumble. I want you to be a wise virgin. I don't know if I will or not, but I see that this is a foolish thing you're doing..." Then your name will be in that book (Mal 3:16) of those who spoke to one another out of love and encouragement. Dan 12:2,13 — Daniel will rise to his inheritance in the Kingdom, which will fill the whole earth. He will rise to age-lasting life (everlasting means lasting for an entire age — forever is one age; forever and ever is eternity), not regret or shame or contempt.

You can see that very easily we can have regret. Why? Because we didn't love one another, because we got mad at one another, didn't care for each other. Therefore we lost our revelation. He quit revealing Himself to us. The "man clothed in linen" said to Daniel (Dan 12:9-10) that when this intense purification takes place among us, who will be found to be wise and not foolish or wicked, but will know that the morning and evening sacrifices were established to be the means by which our prayers are heard so that we can be the restoration of Acts 2:42.

Dan 12:1 — At that time the great prince who protects Daniel's end-time people will stand up or arise (Dan 10:21

— Michael is our angelic prince right now, he is presently protecting us.

Written in the book of truth (Dan 12:1; Ex 32:32; Ps 9:5; 51:1; 29:28) will be His treasured possession (Mal 3:16 17) in the day when "He acts" (Mal 4:3). He's not acting now; He's building and preparing, but it's not yet that day when "He acts" as in Mal 4:3. That is the day He is preparing for and recording in His book of remembrance those who feared Yahweh.

Rev 3:5 — This is the book of life of one's inheritance if he gave himself to the process of being purified, made white, and refined (Dan 12:10; Rev 3:4-6; 19:7-8), so as to be ready for the day of Mal 4:3 — this day is at hand (Isa 52:15; 63:2-3; 52:10; 40:5; 60:3). In that day we will have a new name and a new status (Isa 62:4,12) and receive a crown of glory (Isa 62:3; 28:5; Zec 9:16).

Now He is cutting His chosen stone out of this fallen world's mountain and dressing us, trimming us, making us fit close to one another, perfectly adjusted, tightly fit in place in His foundation. The nucleus is the central mass to which the rest are gathered, the central focal portion, the core — like the nucleus of truth, the rock of our salvation. The nucleus is not allowed to have any division, strife, envy, or selfish ambition if the rest are to be gathered to it (Isa 56:1,8).

The nucleus is the central focal point. The core cannot be rotten. The nucleus is the central factor in the construction of the whole house, as in a plant, the essential factor in its construction, its metabolism, growth, and reproduction, the hereditary transmission of character. Accretion is based on the nucleus, which is the process by which the stone is made (Isa 56:8).

The first stones are the heart, the first organ to be formed in the human being. The heart must be healthy. The stem must be healthy and full of love flowing from it. The heart is formed, and then the whole Body (Isa 49:6), to do its allotted purpose, which is to be a sacrifice (Rom 12:1-2) as a ransom for the greater cause — to rule eternally with Messiah (Rev 22:5) over the trillions and trillions of galaxies filled with the "men" of the nations (Rev 21:3-4), forever increasing.

Isa 62:12 — This is what we are called — sought out, essential, necessary for Yahweh's eternal purpose. His ultimate intention from which He derived His plan for the whole of His creation was that His sought-out ones would rule over all the works of His hands (Ps 8:4-6; Heb 2:7,10,11,12,13).

The nucleus consists of all the ones who were chosen from the beginning until the birth of the nation. The foundation is laid and the walls of the building are ready to rise (Isa 49:14-18; 56:8). Isa 49:14 — After 1900 years the breech is now repaired (Isa 58:12; 59:12).

Dan 12:10 — If the nucleus does not have insight and understanding, how will the others be gathered to them, and for what reason? For years now the nucleus has been going through what it takes for this insight to blossom into understanding. The foundation is almost laid (1 Cor 3:9-15).

Isa 59:21 will bring about the fulfillment of the Law (Ex 20:5-6), the Male Child (Rev 14:1-5), and the Year of Jubilee (Heb 10:13; Rev 11:15).
