

Ruling is Fulfilling our Created Purpose

Yatsaq – I'm thankful we're in a place where we're being restored. I'm thankful I live with people who are being re-linked to our Father and because we are then of course we'll have fellowship with one another. I'm thankful we're being restored in our souls.

Baruch – The line from the song we sang. "Our faith is in the promise made to Abraham," means because we're connected to him our faith is the only thing that enables us to be able to rest. The responsibility is on us to bring about the promise made to Abraham, in this age. It is the fulfillment of all things. We can't go back on our promise. Our Father is able to do as He's promised. He is El Shaddai. I'm thankful we can spend this day together and appreciate our forefather Abraham, for the faith He had in the promise.

Now we are getting ready for the Sabbath rest for 1,000 years when we'll rule and reign with our Master. There'll be no rest there. We'll be ruling and reigning as our Father and our Master are. Throughout all eternity we'll continue to be servants of our Master. We won't rest in the next age. We'll be looking after the people of the nations who will be propagating life, on earth and then to the galaxies (far-reaching to the universe). We will be their light, their understanding and revelation. They will depend on and trust us 100% to be their helpers, guardians and comforters.

Ps 148:3 – *"Praise him, sun and moon, praise him, all you shining stars."* All created things praise and worship him. He created man and when we praise and worship Him we are doing what He created us to do. The sun and moon were given to man to give light to him on earth. They don't have a choice; they are programmed to give light, they are doing their job, what they were created to do.

We are the same way, but man is fallen. They don't praise Him, like the animals do. Man lives to please himself. They don't reflect the Creator. All created things, the trees, the flowers, everything – serve Him. They *rule*. *Ruling* is doing what you're supposed to do. We are being trained to be the rulers of the universe, with the men and women of the nations who have lived by their conscience, their vice-regent. They knew right from wrong, and if they tried to do the right thing, they'll rule.

Ps 136:7-9 – He made all created things to rule, doing what they were created to do. The celestial body that illuminates the earth (the sun, moon and stars), worship God. It's the same as *to serve*. Ps 8 speaks of creation – verse 3, *"When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place (ordained)..."* We are ordained priests who are to rule by day and by night. That's what we were created to do. Verse 4 – *"What is man that you are mindful of him?"* Mindful means that you pay attention to (like caring for orphans and widows). Verse 5 – He made us a little lower than Elohim (not the angels – that's a Jewish tradition). He made man in the image of God and crowned him with glory and honor (verse 5). He made us to rule over all the universe. The heavens are the work of His hands. In verse 6 it says, *"You made him ruler over the works of your hands; you put everything under his feet."*

That's what He wants us to do; to rule over everything, to take dominion over the enemy and go! When there is dissension someone has to rule in the situation. Then the Shabbat can come. Then He will return and rule for 1,000 years. Then His servants will rule and reign forever and ever (Rev 22:3-5).

All created things serve and worship God. They do what they were created to do. Some animals serve man, doing what they were created to do. We want to be rulers. What is a ruler? Anything that is doing what it was created to do. We will rule for eternity over all the galaxies; for ever and ever, no rest day or night. We'll have immortal bodies then, empowered by the divine spirit to rule and serve. There are people who have wept because of the hardships they have had in their lives. They didn't know the good news, but they lived by their conscience. They served the Creator, not the enemy. They weren't perfect, but they wanted to do the right thing. They saw death, tornadoes, drought and they have tears that need to be wiped away. We will do that for them. Most of us weren't like that; we weren't worthy of the nations. We'll wipe their tears away. Some people of the nations living now will be "scions" and will go over to the next age, into the Shabbat reign of our Master Yahshua.

I'm thankful we can come here to celebrate the Shabbat and to gather together to express what's on our hearts. We have thanksgiving that we are able to rest.

Zedek – I'm thankful it's going to happen. There'll be twelve tribes ruling and humanity will be restored. It's the highest calling that we can be called to, to serve.

Yowceph – When the sun shines it's doing what it was created to do; it's ruling, illuminating the earth. The moon is the same way; it's functioning the way it's supposed to. But man is fallen and he's not doing what he was created to do. Our Father is looking for men and women who will do their created purpose in this age. And when that trumpet sounds we will rise – some to age-lasting life and some to age-lasting contempt (Dan 12:2-3). The wise virgins are those who will have illumination like it says in verse 3, *"Those who are wise will shine like the brightness of the heavens, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever."*

Our calling is to rule. That's what we were created for, to be illuminaries for ever and ever, to be those who when the trumpet sounds will go to age-lasting glory, to rule with Him.
