When the Spanking Stopped Proverbs 23:14

When the spanking stopped, all hell broke loose. Look at the moms and the pops allowing their children to wear their clothes the way they do. Only a worthless person wears his pants down low, showing his underwear, or wears his pants so they buckle up over his shoes and drag on the floor. We used to say, "Show sock," but now it's, "Show underwear." When the spanking stopped, kids grew up, and now look at their children — nothing but a bunch of bastards, according to the Bible. But who believes it anyway? Certainly not those who had those unwanted little bastards in the first place.

Pr 13:24 is pretty clear, and so is Heb 12:7-9. What about parents who raise their mistakes to be bastards? It would have been better if they were aborted than to live and grow up and go to hell. This is becoming a bastard nation.

One twin miscarried. The mother died, giving birth to the other. The other was made the biggest bastard that's ever been. He is going to hell. Wouldn't it have been better if he had never been born also? Which one will be the happiest in eternity?

One billion sperm cells died. Only one got in. Who will be the best off if the one who made it goes to hell? I would have rather been one of the billion that died than the one that made it — that is, if I had my rathers.

The First School of Bastards

Public schools are educating bastards. If they weren't bastards before they enrolled, they will be sure to make bastards out of them by the 12th grade. And if they go on to college, they will have the power to make many more go to hell for sure. They make sure that none escape.

Hell is actually a place of torment according to the Son of God, the Word of God speaking through Him (Lk 16:28). It's really death, but called Hades or Sheol. But Lk 16:28 is just the first death. The second death is eternal, as the other scriptures describe it. Yahshua, our Master, went there. He went there, so we would not have to go. That's what a *ransom* means. You know, you've heard of the word *redemption*, bought or purchased, redeemed by the blood of the Lamb.

2 Cor 5:15,21 — But if we become like verse 17 then we can spend the rest of our life here doing His will, and the rest of eternity also — ruling with Him over the universe. No bastards go there. No bastards rule (Rev 22:5). But who is the biggest bastard? The child or the dad who "loved" his child too much to spank him (Pr 13:24)? Or does that make sense? Heb 12:7-9 — It would have been better if you had aborted it instead of raising it to go to hell.

So when the spanking stopped, what happened? All hell broke loose.

You should have loved your child enough to abort it before it was born and grew up to be one of the bastards who go to hell, along with the daddy and all governmental people who voted for it, and all people who voted them into office. Probably, a lot of bastards did it.

Now in Heb 12:7-9 they say *illegitimate* and not even sons. But back when it was not politically incorrect, they called them what they were — *bastards*! The question is in verse 7, "For what son is there whom his father does not spank?" Here we are speaking of human fathers (verse 9), who used to be respected. And you'd better believe a child respected his father, for a father is not called a father for nothing, nor is a son called a son for nothing. A father is a father, because he is a father to his son, and a son is a son, because he is a son of a father who loves him. This demands respect in the heart of the child, who is not a bastard. No bastard respects a "father" who loves him too much to spank him (Pr 13:24).

No one now in hell could say, "Thank you, Dr Spock," again (Pr 23:13-14). "Yes, thank you, Dr Spock, you may have saved my butt for a brief moment, but not my soul now, forever and ever."

Pr 20:30 — Corporal discipline will not unduly hurt his son, but save him from unduly punishment in hell. Discipline will avoid death.

"Hell" is speaking of the spirits of the departed who go to a place of torment (Lk 16:28).

God was repudiated right here in the USA, in AD 1963 — no Bible in public school!!! And that's about the time all the spanking stopped. Then all hell broke loose, eating our children up and spitting them out in hell.

To emphasize, Dr. Spock, we can lift our soul in hell, but no longer say, "Thank you, Dr. Spock. You may have saved my butt, but lost my soul in the process." (Pr 23:13-14)

When All the Spanking Stopped:

You saved my butt from swell, but not my soul from hell.

Pr 20:30; 22:6,15 — The rod and correction is corporal spankings (Pr 13:24; 29:15). Discipline is an educational task for a father and mother who love their child, and is necessary until the child learns self-discipline of judgment.

Pr 29:15 — The rod and rebuke give wisdom, but a child left to himself will bring shame and a scandal to his mother. Pr 29:16 — Since spanking stopped, wickedness has increased and multiplied beyond all the past 6,000 years on earth, and this is in only 40 years. But the righteous of Rev 22:11 still used the rod, and we'll see the fall of the wicked who raise up bastards to go to the lake of fire.

Pr 29:17 is what the righteous do.

Pr 29:18 — Where there is no vision, no understanding, people cast off restraint. But the righteous keep the law of conscience, the natural law.

Pr 13:24 demands love, and love demands respect.

Pr 29:21 is not understandable unless it is a bastard son, or it means to pamper a servant in a good way such that you will have him as a son as Abraham did with Eliezer.

Pr 23:14 - Hell = Sheol

Pr 13:24; 19:18; 22:6,15

Pr 19:18; 3:11 — Chastisement means and is suffering with encouragement, for those who do not rebel against the rod.

A bastard (#3541) is a spurious or illegitimate child, a counterfeit, a sham.

What made the child a bastard? It seems that the child was illegitimate. He was not wanted, of course. And when he was born, he wasn't loved, which makes for appalling behavior — to think no one cares about you, not even God. Pr 13:24; 23:15 — You can determine his eternal destiny.

What father is there who doesn't love his child enough to discipline him? Is there such a thing as a father who doesn't love his child as Pr 13:24? No, that father is also illegitimate, a bastard also, who makes a bastard out of his son. The federal and state governments of the United States are all illegitimate today — counterfeits, a sham.

The United States Congress is made up of fathers who don't spank their children. Not only are the Proverbs filled with wisdom, which endorses child corporal discipline, and the New Testament also, but even the natural law of conscience demands spanking. Pr 13:24, as Heb 12:7-9, is absolutely true. If you don't believe it, you are a fool. Why? Because you live as if there is no God (Ps 14:1; 53:1). You are just as big a bastard as you've made your child.

Discipline is vital to a child's self-image. It makes him feel worthwhile. What makes for appalling behavior is the feeling that no one cares about you. Nobody gives a damn about how you behave, not even God. *Discipline* is *essential* to this end.

Nothing could be worse than for civil government to pass laws against corporal discipline. Heb 12:7-9 — It goes against God's law and against natural law as well (Rom 2:12-15), which determines our eternal destiny. Verse 16 — Natural law is Gen 3:22, the knowledge of good and evil. It is good to discipline your child and it is evil not to. Rev 20:12-15 — No bastard will be allowed into the kingdom of God. No such person will be able to be found in the book of life.

If a child or a grown-up is or was without chastisement (of which we all who are legitimate are partakers), then he is a bastard (KJV) and not a son. He is fictitious. Fictitious means not real — not a real father, and not a real son.

Chastisement (Heb 12:8) means to punish in order to correct, by beating with a rod, such as a balloon stick, as the Proverbs give instruction to fathers. Look up the word *beat* in the context of its use in this proverb (Pr 23:13-14).

When the spanking stopped: "The tender mercies of the wicked are cruel." (Pr 12:10). Sugar daddies' hatred and cruelty is making for themselves bastards (Heb 12:7-9). It's sugar daddies' cruelty and tender mercies that spoil, ruin, and devastate their child and send it to hell.

When the spanking stopped, everyone turned into bastards: father and child.

Pr 23:14 — Beat/spank — This should motivate permissive parents, who are as Pr 13:24 says, and show hate toward their children. Parents are afraid of the Social Services' threats, or Congress, or of hurting their child by corporal punishment, or making restrictions for them by upholding them by the rod. There is no call here in Pr 23:14 or 20:30 for abuse. Loving a child does not destroy a child who is rebellious, but does him good.

Dogs today go to obedience schools, and children go to hell.

Since the spanking stopped, and now since the pangs of childbirth stopped, what else will be erased from Gen 3:16-19? When the pangs of childbirth stop, the pangs of death will be eternal. Since capital punishment stopped (Gen 9:5-6), all who agree are condemned (Rom 1:32).

"Choose Life and Live!" blasted the big billboard, and under it the question, "Aren't you glad your mother did?"

"Well, it's all according to where I'm going now... for eternity..." "Will I live, or die and go to hell?"
