Beautiful Feet

It's not enough to know our Master Yahshua; we must introduce Him to others. So "How beautiful are the feet" of the walkers sent out in the power of the Holy Spirit (Rom 10:9-17), just at the right time to meet someone who is ready to receive them?

Jn 13:20; Mt 10:40-41; Lk 19:10

Rom 10:15 is none other than the feet that walk and walk to where they meet those who hear the good news, and by hearing they receive the faith to obey the good news of salvation. But as Rom 10:16, not all have obeyed or will obey the good news.

How beautiful are the feet of those who were sent out to find you?

The word beautiful (#5611, from #5610) is meant to explain that they were sent out at the proper time and season, just when you were there for them to meet, and now you are here where He is (Jn 12:25-26).

Rom 10:15 — How beautiful are your feet?

Lk 19:10; Jn 13:20; Lk 10:16; Mt 10:41-42

"At just the right time when I was walking down the street your feet caught up with me."

Rom 10:15 speaks of the walkers whom our Master sends out (Jn 7:18) to seek and to save the lost ones. Walking has to do with feet, and *beautiful* has to do with where they walked at just the right time.

Rom 10:15 is the mandate to send out walkers (Mt 10:40-41; Jn 7:17-18; 2 Cor 5:18-20). A mandate is an official command with the authority to act for another, to delegate. To send out walkers is a mandate which is mandatory for all communities that have beautiful-footed disciples, pleasing to their Master, and to all who send them out to make disciples (Mt 28:18-20). Mt 10:6,23 — A mandate for the tribal areas of the twelve tribes of Israel (Isa 49:6; Jms 1:1; Acts 26:7; Mal 1:5,11), the towns in every place (city or town, Mt 10:23), to the end of the age (Mt 28:20; 24:14).

How beautiful (at the right time) that you came to me and brought me such a timely message, just when I was in despair, ready for the good news. How timely were the feet of them who brought glad tidings, who proclaimed the good news of peace to me (Isa 52:7).

How pleasant were your feet which brought you to me, a suitable message at the suitable time, comely, befitting the messenger's feet, suitable... but unbefitting for the one who was not willing (Jn 7:17). The senseless, foolish man (Pr 17:7) is opposite to the one who takes the responsibility for his own sins to heart. The gospel is not befitting to the proud or to the fool (Pr 19:10; 26:1). But praise is appropriate or suitable for the upright (Ps 33:1). Befitting is when the walker meets the one who is willing, for whom the good news is suitable, in good timing, planned by the Holy Spirit.

Suitable (Jn 13:20) or not suitable? (Lk 10:16; Jn 3:18)

Eph 6:15; Rom 10:15 — The feet of the sent one are beautiful in the right time and suitable for and appropriate to the hearer. They were beautiful in the eyes of the beholder.

At the appointed time, it is written, you are destined to calm the wrath of God before it breaks out in fury, to turn the hearts of the parents to their children, and to restore the tribes of Jacob. (Sir 48:10)

At the right time in history, as it is written in Isa 49:6,8 and Mal 4:5-6 — at the appropriate time, when their feet will be beautiful to the beholder, those who receive them and receive Yahshua.

2 Cor 6:2, Isa 49:8 — In the right day and age, the proper time (Dan 2:44; 12:4). Just at the right time when your feet were beautiful to me. The one who is sent is received (Jn 13:20) at the right or suitable time (Isa 49:1-6,8; 42:1-4; 50:4-9).
