

“How in the World?”

Christian doctrine and teachings are supposedly from the New Testament as they instruct new converts to obey Mt 28:19-20, thus fulfilling the so-called Great Commission. The program is to make disciples of all (races or people in the) nations, and the way it is to be done is twofold: 1) by “baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,” and 2) by “teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you.”

Now here’s the catch. How “in the world” can they do that? How can they obey all that He commanded His disciples to do? Well, let’s look at the commandments in the gospels, the ones He has commanded His disciples to keep if they love Him (Jn 14:15,21).

So I say, “How in the world?” can they fulfill the commission of Mt 28 without 1 Cor 1:2 and Jn 12:26? How can they do it without being that witness of this very gospel? No Christian can keep its commandments without a set-apart place to do so (as Acts 2 and 4 tell us actually existed on the earth , where Acts 2:44 and Lk 14:33 are obeyed. It is all spelled out in the “Great Commission” — something no Christian can attain to (Eph 2:10; 4:16).
