## The Unfinished Symphony Who Will Finish It?

Who will finish what the first church did not complete or bear the fruit of before they all fell away from their designated purpose and became Christianity? They did not produce the fruit of the Kingdom (Mt 21:43). Isaiah prophesied that the Messiah would see the fruit of the travail of His soul in death and be satisfied (Isa 53:11, RSV), but is He satisfied with Christianity? Who will produce the fruit that both old Israel and the first church failed to produce? This teaching reveals the purpose to which the first church did not attain, but what we gain is what is written in the epistles concerning how they fell.

What does the symphony produce? What is the ultimate purpose? Who will finish the course?

The New Covenant community in Mt 21:43 is to be the answer to the Old Covenant, as the Messiah in Mt 21:33-45 explains the failure of the Jews to recognize their long-awaited Deliverer or His ways. As it is plain to see, Mt 21:43 and 24:14 bring to fruition all that the long-awaited Messiah taught. The only way Israel will be restored (Acts 3:21) is when this present age is brought to its close by a New Covenant Israel who bear the fruit of this coming kingdom. In order for Israel to be set free from bondage to the evil one's rule (1 Jn 5:19), this new Israel, as Isa 49:6 says, must first do Gen 18:19 before Isa 49:8 (Gen 15:18) can be done or fulfilled.

As Paul said in Acts 26:7-8 (Rom 11:15), the promise to Abraham will be fulfilled for the One who promised Gen 15:18, but only after Gen 18:19 is done by the restored spiritual nation at the end of this age. Then Gen 15:18 can be fulfilled, which the Jews thought would be done when the Messiah would appear, but Jn 1:11 is what actually happened when He appeared, and not only that, but Mt 27:25 also, as the apostles continually proclaimed, over and over again (Acts 2:23,36; 3:15; 4:10; 5:30; 7:52, etc.). All who *did* receive Him (Jn 1:12) on the day of Pentecost, fifty days after His resurrection, plus those in Acts 21:20, came out from under the bloodguilt of Mt 27:25. When they heard that they had killed the very One they were waiting for to deliver them from their bondage to Rome and to rule the world, they were struck as if by lightning enlightening their soul. On the day of Pentecost, ten days after the Messiah ascended to His Father in heaven and sent the Holy Spirit, the 3000 heard the whole message and were cut to the heart and cried out in absolute utter agony of heart and soul when they heard Acts 2:36, screaming, "Brothers, what shall we do?" Then they heard the many other words in verse 40.

The New Covenant community and nation of Mt 21:43 was to be the fulfillment which the old rebellious descendents of Abraham would not accomplish. John the Baptist told them He could make natural descendents of Abraham out of stones (Mt 3:9), but not the seed of Abraham who were as Gen 18:19, who would bring about Gen 15:18, lest God Himself be as Jer 34:18-19 (Gen 15:17). What good are natural descendents any more than anyone else? What good is anyone as far as God's purposes are concerned who are not as Gal 3:26-29?

So in order to bring this to fruition, Mt 21:43 was necessary, since the natural twelve tribes of Israel had now been reduced to just a small remnant in Judea who did not receive the long-awaited Messiah, but instead killed Him just as Yahshua foretold in the parable in Mt 21:33-45. This new nation in verse 43 is "our twelve tribes" in Acts 26:7 — the twelve tribes prophesied in Isa 49:6 who would be as 1 Pet 2:9-10.

As Dt 32:5 predicted, Israel would be no longer God's holy people until this new nation would overcome in their place — "for them" (Acts 26:6-8, Williams; Rom 11:12-15). Without this new nation, Israel of old was a useless endeavor in regard to fulfilling Gen 15:18, since they never did Gen 18:19, so it was left to another people (Dan 2:44) who would do it for them. Heb 10:13 would bring about Acts 3:21 as spoken by the prophets (Rev 1:7; Zec 12:10; 13:8). One third of the natural descendents of Abraham in

the last days would go through the fire to become that nation prophesied by Messiah Himself in Mt 19:28, when Mt 24:14 puts an end to this present age. Then Gen 15:18 will be done for 1000 years in the next age.

Mt 19:28 is in the next age; Mk 9:11-12 is the restoration in this present age to bring about Acts 3:21 in the next age. Before the next age can come, Mk 9:11-12 must happen, which is the restoration prophesied in Isa 49:6, which is the witness in Mt 24:14, which is the fruit in Mt 21:43. This fruit cannot come about unless the restoration of all things brings back the reality of Acts 4:32 as commanded in Jn 13:34-35 and prayed for in 17:21-23, and this takes communities in every place as Mal 1:5,11 and 1 Tim 2:8 and 1 Cor 1:2.

No movement can do all this without the power of the Holy Spirit to fulfill Dan 2:44 in the days of those ten kings (Dan 7:24; Rev 17:12,16), which are the days of Dan 12:4,9.

So just as it was originally in Acts 2 and 4, so shall it be before this age can come to its end. Mk 9:11-12 is Acts 2:44 — All who believe (now) will be as it was before the church grew apostate and became that diseased tree bearing bad fruit (Mt 7:17-18, ESV), not the fruit in Mt 21:43 (Gal 5:22-23), for without faith it is impossible.

Restoration is imperative to bring about the return of the Messiah, unless He is to be known as a failure. The Christian Jesus is a failure since 2 Cor 11:4,13-15 describes why they are split up into 39,000 sects. So we see now that there must be that restoration which Yahshua predicted or else He is a false prophet, since no one has received the Holy Spirit since Rev 2:5 happened in every place.

We named this paper *The Unfinished Symphony* which must be finished through the restoration of the same ancient sound as was in the beginning. If the restored New Covenant Twelve Tribes (Acts 26:7) does not raise the dead Twelve Tribes of Israel in the next age, then we all labor (serve, worship) in vain (Acts 26:7-8). If our newly restored Twelve Tribes is not the answer to the old Twelve Tribes, then the old will never have an answer. But it will be the true, clear, glorious fulfillment to the symphony that was left unfinished when in the second century all started to go out of tune and off course, and 1 Pet 2:9 never fulfilled Ex 19:5-6.
