You Can Do Nothing Without Me

We are taught in Pr 2:1-9 how to become like our Master Yahshua. Everything in this chapter of Proverbs is everything our Master is, which He gained through prayer: wisdom, knowledge, understanding, discernment and knowledge; and then finally, after praying for all of that, then we finally come to having discretion. This is what He truly is. Our Master is described by all the qualities in that proverb, and more.

We have to seek for those things in Pr 2:1-9. I had to seek for it this morning, and I was even empty. I had to say, "Father, I can do nothing; I am empty without your Spirit ruling my spirit and filling my soul." He hides from us, so we have to seek for Him. But if we seek for Him, we will find Him — at the gathering, right there, in our brothers and sisters.

Jn 15:5 — When I read this, I knew that our Master was speaking directly to my heart; and I knew, from that day on, that I could do nothing without Him. That is when I just started trusting in Him, because I knew I could do nothing. It was truth. He said, "You can do nothing," and I knew that meant nothing. I believe there is nothing I can do apart from Him. Oh, anyone can do many things, but nothing that is profitable. It counts for nothing unless it is done with Him.

So for this reason, we want to pray for all that is written in Pr 2:1-9, to finally come to have discretion — the discretion that leads to life, to be delivered from the way of evil (Pr 2:10-15), and from the way leading to death (Pr 2:16-19), so that we will be faithful and remain in the land (Pr 2:20-22).
